Transformation Journal

January 17th, 2010



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Each day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, January 17th

Sermon Notes:

Read 1 Thessalonians 1:2-8. What kind of labor of love would be so powerful as to provide an example for all those who follow Christ in a two state area? What would it take for our church to live out our faith in this way?

Monday, January 18th

Read 1 Thessalonians 4:1-10. Paul encourages the church to live to please God (v.1) and love (v. 10) “more and more.” Think about the ways that you please God and love others. How can those practices become more and more a part of your life and example?

Tuesday, January 19th

Read Romans 12:9-21. Then read the passage again and see what instruction God calls to your attention. Focus your thoughts and prayers on this instruction. How can you better live it out in your life? How would living it out impact the example you provide of our faith?

Wednesday, January 20th

Read 2 Corinthians 5:20. As ambassadors, we represent Christ to those who cannot see Christ. As Christians, all that we do represents Christ, either positively or negatively. How does the understanding that we are always ambassadors of Christ challenge you to live?

Thursday, January 21st

Read Matthew 5:13-16. How has the light of God transformed you into a light for others? Do you shine that light into the lives of those around you or do you keep the light covered? Why?

Friday, January 22nd

Read Acts 4:23-31. In the face of persecution, the early church prayed for boldness and lived boldly for Christ. What would it look like for you to live your faith boldly? Pray that God will give you the strength!

Saturday, January 23rd

Read Romans 15:1-6. How does this change your attitude in dealing with those who can annoy you? How can you better serve as an example of our faith to those who are around you?

Sunday, January 24th

As you get ready for worship today, take time to prepare your heart to see God. Offer this prayer: “**Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.**”
