Transformation Journal

January 23, 2011



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, January 23rd

Sermon Notes:

Read Hebrews 13:5-6. We do not often think of Jesus' promise never to leave us in terms of relying on him in our finances, but this is the context of the promise! How does this promise help you to be free to be content with your financial status?

Monday, January 24th

Read 1 Timothy 6:6-10. How have you been tempted to turn away from God by the pursuit of wealth? How have you seen evil come out of the love of money in your life or the lives of those around you? Ask God to remove the love of money from your heart!

Tuesday, January 25th

Read Luke 8:4-15. Jesus refers to one group of would-be disciples as those who begin to follow but are choked out by “the cares and riches and pleasures of life” so that they do not bear fruit. Are you hindered from following Jesus by these thorns? How can you avoid this?

Wednesday, January 26th

Read Matthew 4:8-10. How does the devil tempt you with material gain if you will turn away from the path that God has laid out for you and embrace the devil’s plan? When have you fallen into this trap? When have you been able to resist?

Thursday, January 27th

Read Ecclesiastes 5:10. When our goal is “more,” we will never have enough! In your financial life, what is enough? How can you cultivate a sense of contentment with what you have now?

Friday, January 28th

Read Exodus 20:17. The commandment not to covet is often overlooked because it is about our internal state rather than an action. Why is not coveting so important that God put it in the ten commandments?

Saturday, January 29th

Read Philippians 4:11-13. Paul’s life varied from cold, hungry and imprisoned to well-fed and comfortable, but he was content in every situation. Why? Ask God to establish this contentment in you!

Sunday, January 30th

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: “**Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.**”

Readings: Luke 19:1-10; Matthew 6:24 and 25:14-30; Ephesians 5:5
