-Unity among church leaders in the town of Ulaangom where Charis hopes to move to this summer after language classes.

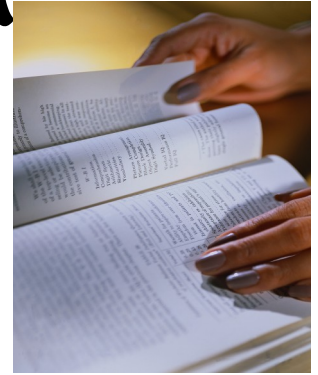
-Direction about what to focus on during this time of waiting until Charis is able to return to Mongolia.

Transformation Journal

February 14th, 2010



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Each day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, February 14th

Sermon Notes:

Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-21. What does it mean to be an ambassador of Jesus Christ? Think about your relationships and interactions with those around you. In what ways does the realization that you are an ambassador of Christ challenge you to change how you act?

Monday, February 15th

Read Colossians 1:19-23. What does it mean that you have been reconciled to God through Christ? How does knowledge of this reconciliation impact your relationship with God? What does it mean that God was pleased to reconcile “all things?”

Tuesday, February 16th

Read Romans 10:9-17. What is the role of the missionary in leading people toward salvation according to this passage? What is your role? Is God calling you to be a missionary either in our local area or some other part of the country or world?

Wednesday, February 17th

Read Acts 1:6-8. Jesus calls the disciples to be witnesses in Jerusalem (local area), Judea and Samaria (state) and to the ends of the earth. We are called to be witnesses in all three areas . How are you witnessing in these areas? Is God calling you to do anything differently?

Thursday, February 18th

Read Jonah 3-4. God sent Jonah to a people that Jonah did not want to receive God’s mercy. Who is God calling you to share the Good News with? Ask God to guide you in *your* missionary journey!

Friday, February 19th

Read Acts 6:1-7. This group was chosen for a mission of caring for the hungry because of their specific gifts. God’s call for you is specific as well. Talk with God about how God is calling you to serve.

Saturday, February 20th

Read Philippians 4:15-20. The church in Philippi took seriously their role to send Paul as a missionary. What can you do to be one who is sending missionaries into the mission field?

Sunday, February 21st

As you get ready for worship today, take time to prepare your heart to see God. Offer this prayer: **“Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”**
