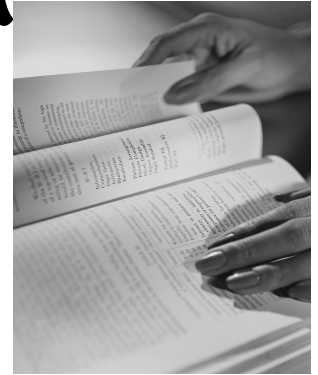
Prayers for the church, nation, and world:

Transformation Journal

February 27, 2011



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, February 27th

Sermon Notes:

Read 1 John 4:7-16. John tells us that “God is love.” What does it mean for God to be love? How does it help you to understand God more fully to realize that everything that God does springs from a motive of love?

Monday, February 28th

Read Luke 15:11-32. When the younger son was still a long way off, the father saw him and ran to him. How does it help you to understand God knowing God is watching for you and ready to run to you when you turn to God?

Tuesday, March 1st

Read Deuteronomy 7:7-9. We do not often think of God being motivated by love in the Old Testament, but this passage makes clear that God chose the Israelites because of God’s love for them. How does this help you understand God more fully?

Wednesday, March 2nd

Read Romans 8:31-39. Go through this list of things that Paul tells us cannot separate us from God’s love. Do you wonder if some of these things can separate you from God’s love? Which ones? Talk with God about your concern!

Thursday, March 3rd

Read John 15:12-17. Jesus declares that the greatest love anyone can have is to do what he has done for us. How does it feel to know that God’s love for you is the greatest love possible?

Friday, March 4th

Read Romans 5:6-11. God’s love for us was shown in Jesus giving his life before we had done anything to earn God’s love. How does it feel to know that God’s love is unconditional?

Saturday, March 5th

Read Isaiah 43:1-7. God’s great love for us means that we need not fear. When do you struggle with fear? Talk to God about those times and places when you are afraid and hear God’s words of love to you!

Sunday, March 6th

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: **“Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”**
