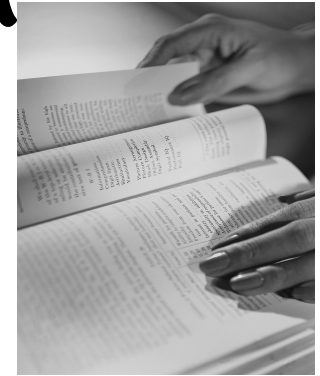
### Prayers for the church, nation, and world:
