Read Genesis 1:26-28. In the beginning God created men and women and gave us authority over the earth. By doing this God chose to act here through people and our prayers. How are you living as a person whom God has called to oversee the earth on God's behalf?

Monday, March 14th
Read 1 Kings 18. God wanted to send a drought and so God asked
Elijah to pray for it. When God was ready to end the draught, God
again asked Elijah to pray. What does this passage teach you about
how God works? What is God asking you to pray for?

Read Ezekiel 22:23-31. Ezekiel tells us about a time when God wanted
to have mercy on the people, but in the face of the evil they were
practicing, with no one to pray for them, God had no choice but to
judge. Ask God to show you how God wants to show mercy and pray!

Read Amos 7:1-6. God showed Amos what God was planning and then
Amos pleaded with God for mercy and God relented. These are the
prayers that were missing in Ezekiel's time (see Tuesday). What do
you learn from Amos' prayers?
