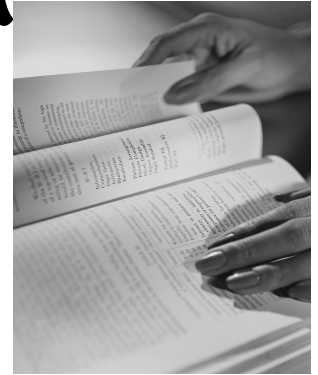
Prayers for the church, nation, and world:

Transformation Journal

March 13, 2011



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, March 13th

Sermon Notes:

Read Genesis 1:26-28. In the beginning God created men and women and gave us authority over the earth. By doing this God chose to act here through people and our prayers. How are you living as a person whom God has called to oversee the earth on God's behalf?

Monday, March 14th

Read 1 Kings 18. God wanted to send a drought and so God asked Elijah to pray for it. When God was ready to end the draught, God again asked Elijah to pray. What does this passage teach you about how God works? What is God asking you to pray for?

Tuesday, March 15th

Read Ezekiel 22:23-31. Ezekiel tells us about a time when God wanted to have mercy on the people, but in the face of the evil they were practicing, with no one to pray for them, God had no choice but to judge. Ask God to show you how God wants to show mercy and pray!

Wednesday, March 16th

Read Amos 7:1-6. God showed Amos what God was planning and then Amos pleaded with God for mercy and God relented. These are the prayers that were missing in Ezekiel’s time (see Tuesday). What do you learn from Amos’ prayers?

Thursday, March 17th

Read Luke 11:1-12. Take some time to join your voice with the voices of the disciples and pray “Lord, teach us to pray.” Commit to God that you, like the disciples, will listen to how God answers your prayer!

Friday, March 18th

Read Luke 11:1-12. Jesus teaches us to pray “Thy kingdom come” because our prayers help God’s desires to become reality on earth. What do you see that God wants to do in our community. Pray for it!

Saturday, March 19th

Read Luke 6:12-19. Jesus spends the night in prayer to hear from God before choosing the 12 disciples. How do you hear from God in prayer? Are you willing to spend the night in prayer?

Sunday, March 20th

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: “**Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.**”
