Thursday, March 29th Read Colossians 3:1-5. You have died! Talk with God about what it means that you have died and how you can then "put to death" those things in your life that oppose God. Prayer focus: Pray for Charis Storms that she would know her life to be hidden in Christ as she seeks to put to death all ungodliness in herself/.
Tuesday, March 27th Read Hebrews 2:9-15. What do you think of the idea that Jesus was made perfect through suffering? How does knowing about Jesus' suffering help you to connect to him and receive help from him? Prayer focus: Pray for church plants, Journey UMC and the Stand UMC, that they would draw near to their suffering Savior.	Friday, March 30th Read John 15:1-11. Have you been "pruned" by God? How did God change your life to make you more fruitful? Are you willing to be pruned by God again? Prayer focus: Pray for the people of Syria as the country continues in a time of unrest and the government arrests and kills protestors.
Wednesday, March 28th Read John 5:31-38. Why do you think that those who opposed Jesus could "never hear God's voice"? Are you open to hearing God's voice even if God is speaking a word of rebuke to you? Prayer focus: Pray for the United Methodist General Conference that every delegate would be able to hear from God.	Saturday, March 31st Read Colossians 1:15-22. Take some time to reflect on the power of the cross to reconcile all things to God because of Jesus' willingness to pray, "Father, Glorify your name." Can you pray that prayer? Prayer focus: Pray for the church in China, Hong Kong, and Macao that they would be willing to take up their cross and follow Jesus.
