-For the people of Mexico, as they live amid the increasing violence of a drug war.

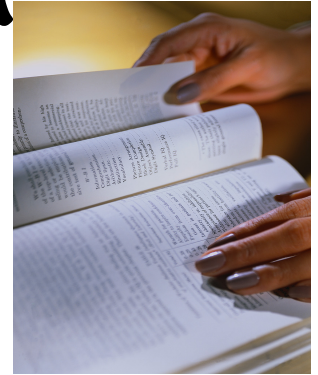

Transformation Journal

March 28th, 2010



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, March 28th

Sermon Notes:

Read Luke 19:28-40. Envision yourself in this crowd. How does this time of celebration and excitement make you feel? What does this time teach you about worship? Take time to worship Jesus as your king and savior.

Monday, March 29th

Read Mark 11:12-19. We do not often think of Jesus as being angry, but he is angry today. Envision yourself in this story. Feel Jesus' anger. Why is he angry? Who is he caring for by driving the money changers out? How does the crowd react?

Tuesday, March 30th

Read Matthew 21:23-46. Jesus taught that the religious leaders were missing the kingdom of God. How do you think Jesus felt to be rejected by the people who should have embraced him? If you have time, read more of Jesus' teachings during this time (chapters 22-25).

Wednesday, March 31st

Read Matthew 26:1-16. Today is marked by two opposite acts: one act of generosity in worship and one act of selfishness in betrayal. Envision yourself in these stories. How do you feel as you see these events unfold before your eyes?

Maundy Thursday, April 1st

Read Matthew 26:17-56 and John 12:1-20. Again, envision yourself in these events. As you read, notice what is important to Jesus during the last full day of his life.

Good Friday, April 2nd

Read John 18:12-19:42. Allow yourself to walk with Jesus through the pain of betrayal, abandonment, ridicule, lashings and crucifixion. Talk with God about your feelings as you envision the crucifixion.

Holy Saturday, April 3rd

Read Isaiah 53. Scripture is silent about what happens this day while Jesus lies dead in the tomb. Reflect on all that has brought us to this day and Christ's work to bear our transgressions.

Easter Sunday, April 4th

As you get ready for worship today, take time to prepare your heart to celebrate the resurrection. Offer this greeting to your family and speak it to yourself:

“Christ is Risen!”

“He is Risen Indeed!”
