Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, April 3rd

Sermon Notes:

Read Luke 11:1-13. Think about what motivates the person in Jesus' parable to bang on the neighbor's door at midnight. What is important enough to you that you would bang on your neighbor's door at midnight? How do you pray for things you are passionate about?

Monday, April 4th

Read Matthew 21:12-13. We often struggle in reading this passage, because Jesus does not look like the gentle shepherd we are used to seeing. What do you learn from Jesus' passion that God's house be a house of prayer?

Tuesday, April 5th

Read Nehemiah 1. Nehemiah's passion is for restoration in Jerusalem (which had been destroyed by an invading army). When he realizes that the city is not being rebuilt, he fasts, mourns, prays and then acts. What do you learn from Nehemiah's example?

Wednesday, April 6th

Read 2 Kings 20:1-11. Hezekiah responds to a word from God with passionate prayer. In response to his prayer, God sends Isaiah back to say "I have seen your tears...I will heal you" (v.5). Why do you think that Hezekiah's tears were an important part of his prayer?

Thursday, April 7th

Read Jeremiah 29:11-14. Why does Jeremiah include the phrase "if you seek me with all your heart" (v.13)? Why is it important that we seek God with all our heart? How do you seek God with all your heart?

Friday, April 8th

Read Joel 2:1-17. Joel calls the people to repentance with "all your heart." When have you heard God call you to return? How have you responded with all of your heart?

Saturday, April 9th

2 Chronicles 31:1-21. The end of this passage tells us that God was pleased with Hezekiah's actions because he did everything for God with all of his heart. How do you live out your passion for God?

Sunday, April 10th

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: "Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus' name, Amen."
