Prayers for the church, nation, and world:

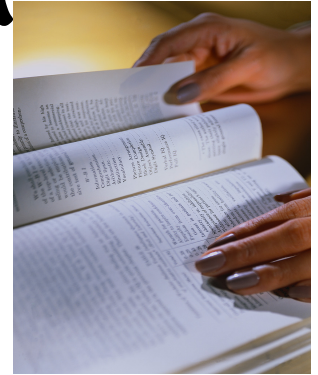
-For our churches, that we can determine the *labor of love* to which God is calling us

Transformation Journal

Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, April 18th

Sermon Notes:

Read John 21:1-19. Imagine yourself in Peter's place in this story. You know that you failed Jesus, despite your brash words that you would be the most faithful of his followers. Imagine Jesus asking about your love three times. How do you feel?

Monday, April 19th

Read Daniel 4. As a result of his pride, the king is driven away and lives like an animal. When his sanity is restored, he turns his praise to God instead of himself. Where has pride turned you away from God? How can you turn your focus back to God?

Tuesday, April 20th

Read Exodus 2:11-15. When Moses committed murder, it forced him to flee from Egypt and live as a nomad. His action changed the course of his life, and God was able to work through it to bring good things. How have failures changed your life? How has God brought good out of your failures?

Wednesday, April 21st

Read Hosea 11, 14. Throughout the Old Testament, the people of God turn away, and God disciplines them and invites them back despite their failures. How has God worked to call you to return after your failures?

Thursday, April 22nd

Read Jonah 1:1-3:4. Jonah’s failure was rebelling against God’s call, but God gave him another chance. Is there anything that God is calling you to that you are ignoring? How can you follow more closely?

Friday, April 23rd

Read Jonah 3:1-10. The people of Nineveh were the most ruthless people in the region, and they had many evil acts for which to repent. How do you feel knowing that even the ruthless are given another chance?

Saturday, April 24th

Read Revelation 3. Jesus gives messages to three churches in this chapter. Which message is closest to what God wants to speak to you? Consider how God is calling you to return and then do it!

Sunday, April 25th

We celebrate the resurrection every Sunday, so take time to prepare your heart. Offer this greeting to your family and speak it to yourself:

“Christ is Risen!”

“He is Risen Indeed!”
