Tuesday, June 22nd
Read Romans 15:7. How has Christ welcomed us? Imagine yourself as
an outsider coming to our church for the first time. Would you sense
this kind of welcome? What can we do as a church to ensure that
people receive a Christ-like welcome at our church?
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Wednesday, June 23rd
Read Matthew 22:1-10. The king instructs his servants to invite
everyone that they see to the wedding banquet. As you think about the
people who are part of our church community, who is not here? What
can we do as a church to invite those people to join us?
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THURSDAY, JUNE 24TH

Read Romans 12:9-13. Hospitality is included on this list with other, more "spiritual," concerns. Do you believe that hospitality is a spiritual concern? How can we make hospitality central in our church?
Friday, June 25th
Read 1 Timothy 3:2, Titus 1:7-8. Hospitality was essential for leaders in the early church. Why do you think hospitality was so important at hat time? Do we look for hospitality in our leaders today? Why?
SATURDAY, JUNE 26TH
Read Deuteronomy 10:12-19. Do you remember a time when you were a stranger? How important was it for you to be loved? How can we better love those who are strangers to us?
SUNDAY, JUNE 27TH

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: "Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus' name, Amen."
