Sunday, July 3rd

Sermon Notes:

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take notes and pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Read Luke 24:13-35. Like the disciples, we can go through life without recognizing Jesus even when he is right in front of us. Think about times in your life when you have come to realize that Jesus was with you. What opened your eyes?

Monday, July 4th
Read Galatians 5:1-14. As our country celebrates our freedom as a nation today, take some time to think about the freedom that Jesus has given us from the rules and restrictions of the world. How are you living out your freedom in love?
Tuesday, July 5th Read Numbers 22:22-35. Balaam was unable to see the angel, but his donkey served as his eyes. Who or what around you helps you to see God at times when God is unseen? How can you learn from Balaam to trust those people/things?
Wednesday, July 6th
Read Genesis 21:8-20. In this story, God opens Hagar's eyes to see something that she needed to survive and bring God's desires to pass. Ask God to open your eyes to see what resources are around you that God wants you to use for God's Kingdom purposes.

Thursday, July 7th

Read John 9. To those who think they have spiritual sight, Jesus says
ne has come that they might become blind. Take time to confess that
you are blind and need Jesus to open your eyes!
Friday, July 8th
Read 2 Kings 6:8-23. God uses sight and blindness here to bring about
an unexpected outcome—enemies are transformed into friends. How
does this story challenge you to ask God to work in our community?
Saturday, July 9th
Read Luke 4:16-21. Opening the eyes of the blind was a central part of
Jesus' ministry. Pray that he would open our eyes and the eyes of those
you know need to see Jesus (see also 2 Corinthians 4:4).

Sunday. July 10th

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: "Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus' name, Amen."
