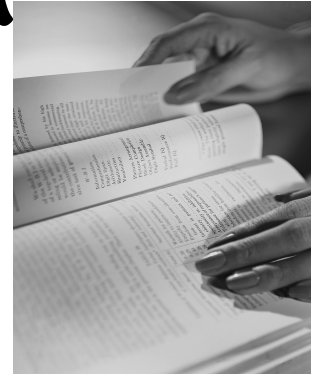
Prayers for the church, nation, and world:

Transformation Journal

September 26, 2010



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, September 26th

Sermon Notes:

Do miracles usually change how we follow God? Why?

Read Luke 16:19-26. What are some reasons why the rich man might have failed to care for Lazarus? How can we avoid falling into those traps? Think about the people around you. Are there any people who you look past every day who God wants you to love?

Monday, September 27th

Read Luke 16:27-31. The rich man mistakenly thought that seeing a miracle would change his brothers. Are there any areas of your faith life where you are saying “if God would act miraculously, then I would follow?” How can you follow God in those areas now?

Tuesday, September 28th

Read John 6:1-27. The crowd follows Jesus because they received a full stomach. Why are you following Jesus? Are you expecting him to bless your selfish desires or are you interested in following even when you gain nothing? Let God search your heart and be honest!

Wednesday, September 29th

Read 1 Kings 22. Imagine yourself in Josiah’s place: You have been relying on tradition and prophets, but now you have God’s teachings in your hands. How would you feel? How does this passage make you feel about the privilege we have of having the Bible?

Thursday, September 30th

Read John 5:39-40. Jesus reminds us that life is found in him not in the words of scripture. How can we allow scripture to lead us to Jesus rather than away from him like what happened with the Pharisees?

Friday, October 1st

Read Psalm 119:1-32. As you read through this passage, which verses stand out to you? Take a few minutes to reflect on one or two verses that catch your attention. Why are these verses significant?

Saturday, October 2nd

Read Psalm 119:105-128. What does it mean for God’s word to be a light on our path? How has scripture given you light? What areas of your life do you feel like you need more light?

Sunday, October 3rd

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: **“Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”**
