# Transformation Journal

September 27th, 2009

*Inviting you to daily time with God.*



Each day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

### Sunday, September 27th

Sermon Notes:

Read James 5:13-20. James clearly believes in the power of prayer. What do you expect to happen when you make a prayer asking for something (prayer of petition)? This week, focus on praying for one specific situation every day. Then write down how God responds!

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**Monday, September 28st**

Read Psalm 104. This psalm is a song or prayer of praise. Join with the psalmist in telling yourself to bless the Lord as you read the psalm.

Then, write a few more things you would like to praise or thank God for. You can either write them as poetry like the psalm or make a list.

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**Tuesday, September 29th**

Read Psalm 80. This psalm combines expressions of lament (5-6, 12-13, 16) over the bad spot they are at in life with petition for God to change things. Take a moment to bring a situation from your life to God. Tell God about the pain and then ask God to be working.

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**Wednesday, September 30th**

Read Psalm 16. This psalm is a prayer declaring trust in God. As you read through the psalm, can you honestly pray this prayer to God? Why or why not? In what ways do you trust God? What is an area in your life that you can come to trust God more?

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**Thursday, October 1st**

Read Psalm 51. This psalm begins with confession and moves to petition. As you read these words of confession, what do you need to confess? Then ask God to make you clean (v. 7, 10).

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**Friday, October 2nd**

Read James 5:1-6. Remember that almost all Americans are wealthy compared to the world! Think about how you “lay up treasure” (v.3). How can you be more faithful with your money?

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**Saturday, October 3rd**

Read James 5:7-12. James gives us the farmer as the model for patience. What is an area in your life where you struggle to be patient? Commit to take an extra breath and embrace patience in that situation!

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**Sunday, October 4th**

As you get ready for worship today, take time to prepare your heart to see God. Offer this prayer: **“Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”**
