what you believe about Jesus' resurrection.	
Wednesday, November 4th	
Read 1 Corinthians 15:35-58. It is clear though that we will have a	
resurrected body and not just exist as a disembodied soul after death.	
How does that impact your understanding of life after death? How do you feel about receiving a transformed body at the resurrection?	

Thursday, November 5th

Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18. What is the difference between grieving with hope and grieving without hope? How does God's promise of
esurrection give you hope?
