Transformation Journal

November 21, 2010



Inviting you to daily time with God.

Every day the Transformation Journal will offer you a scripture passage and a question or two for reflection. Take a few minutes each day, and see what God has for you! The prayer list is also on the back, so please take time to pray for those we have lifted up on Sunday.

Sunday, November 21st

Sermon Notes:

How does Jesus redefine what it means to be King?

Read Colossians 1:11-20. How do you feel when you think that Jesus, the one who has created and is sustaining all things, showed his true Kingly power by giving his life to reconcile all things with God? How well do you follow Christ's example of using power to reconcile?

Monday, November 22nd

Read Luke 23:33-43. Imagine yourself as a bystander reading the sign on Jesus’ cross. How would you feel about Jesus’ title of “King”? Then envision yourself as a witness to the resurrection. How do you feel about Jesus as King now?

Tuesday, November 23rd

Read 1 Corinthians 15:20-28. Paul makes clear that one day, all things will be under Christ’s feet, but that day is yet to come. How does it make you feel to know that one day, all people will see and acknowledge Christ’s reign? How does that impact how you live now?

Wednesday, November 24th

Read Hebrews 10:1-18. Instead of the regular sacrifices of the temple, Jesus gave himself once for all and then sat down at the right hand of God knowing that one day his rule would be obvious to all. How can you live with the purpose and patience that Jesus shows here?

Thursday, November 25th

Read Revelation 4-5. What do you learn from the power that Jesus has as the lamb that has been slaughtered? How does this picture of Jesus impact your understanding of what it means to be the King?

Friday, November 26th

Read Revelation 7:9-17. Take a few moments to imagine yourself as part of this worshipping throng. Praise Jesus for giving himself for you. How does it feel to recognize that the one true King is a lamb?

Saturday, November 27th

Read Psalm 2. This psalm speaks of nations raging against the true King. Honestly consider what ways you might be opposing Jesus. How can you live out the teaching of verses 10-11 more fully?

Sunday, November 28th

As we gather for worship, prepare your heart by focusing on God and offering this prayer: **“Living God, as we gather to worship you today, help me to encounter you, to truly worship you, to hear from you and to have my life changed by you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.”**

Readings: Isaiah 2:1-5; Psalm 122; Romans 13:11-14; Matthew 24:36-44
