What does it mean to be the Presence of Christ?

The mission of the church is to make disciples for Jesus Christ (Mat 28:19). Being a disciple is an ongoing process. Lent or Lint?! Well, it might be both.

Lent is the church season usually expressed as a time of preparation. The word "Lent" comes from a Latin word meaning "40," as in the 40 (non-Sunday) days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. During Lent we often use the word "Repent!" John the Baptist, who prepared the way of the Lord Jesus preached, "Repent! For the Kingdom of heaven is near" (Mat 3:2). Jesus said something similar: "Repent, and believe the Good News" (Mark 1:15). Repent means to turn towards God, away from obstacles that get in the way of our completely loving God.

We get prepared for the resurrection life by 'getting our house in order,' cleaning up our lives so that we are more attentive to God (and a little less toward ourselves). That's where "lint" comes in. An online dictionary defines lint as "clinging bits of fiber and fluff." Not particularly attractive - or useful! A bad habit, or an unhealthy activity, or a costly pastime might be "lint" in your life. Something clinging to you. This Lent, consider removing some Lint if it is an obstacle in your relationship with God.
