Summer Travels

"Let's go to the lake!" It's July and the summer vacation season is in full swing. The warm weather is an ideal season to seek respite from the demands of work. With the children out of school, it's a good time for trips to the beach and the mountains. Living where we do, weekends at the lake are great opportunities to gather with friends for fellowship and renewal.

Jesus spent a lot of time hanging out at the lake – Lake Galilee. The "Sea of Galilee" is actually the largest freshwater lake in Israel. It's roughly twice the size of Lake Gaston. All four Gospels refer repeatedly to Jesus traveling to and from the lake. He even established the lakeshore town of Capernaum as his home while in itinerant ministry.

Traveling from place to place was essential to Jesus' ministry to people. He never stayed too long in one place. He did not want to be a burden on others, or to keep people away from their work for too long. He would arrive in town, or on the lake shore, or at the mountains. There he would love on people, teaching them and making them whole, healing body and spirit. Then he would take his leave and allow them to ponder his visit, reflect on his words and celebrate his deeds.

Our summer travel through the stories of unnamed people in search of the Familiar Faces takes a turn in July. We move from the Old Testament reports of God at work in the

unknown people and places, to a more familiar setting. Our adventures will be "closer to home," as we travel with Jesus around the lake.


Here's our July itinerary: July 14 A Woman's Healing, Mark 5:21-34
