The Preachers' Part

One Sunday, just before the service started, as the pianist played the prelude, the preacher was surprised to find a little boy standing beside him, where he sat at the front of the sanctuary. "Are you Moses?" the little boy asked.

The preacher smiled, realizing the little boy was looking at his alb, the white servant's garment with the cord belt he wore on communion Sundays. "I'm not Moses," the preacher said. "This is a robe, a covering I wear when I serve communion. It's like a uniform for someone who takes care of others; like a shepherd who takes care of his sheep."

Seemingly satisfied, the boy turned and went back to his seat, where he told his grandmother, plainly and matter-of-factly, "He's a shepherd."

"He's a shepherd." It's one of the oldest images in the Bible. Abraham was a shepherd. So was King David. Jesus used sheep and shepherds in several of his parables. Who were the first people told of Jesus' birth? Shepherds.

As your pastor and preacher, I'm thankful for the opportunity to serve you and care for you. I graciously accept the honor and responsibility of being a shepherd on behalf of Jesus. Yet this honor does not belong only to "the Preacher." We are all disciples of Jesus and share responsibility to care for others, love them and serve them, in Christ's name.

When I think of "shepherds," the first image that comes to mind is that of the children of

Antioch lighting the fourth advent candle last December. As the teenagers read the scripture story, and lit the candle "as a symbol of the shepherds, agents of the gospel and redeemers of the world," there knelt all the little ones, in their rough robes and headdress, attentively watching and listening, taking it all in, participating in the worship life of the church. They were giving and receiving.

In August we begin a new school year, in September we initiate a new children's ministry, in October we make plans for the coming new year.... There are lots of sheep to be served, cared for, taught, and led. There are little shepherds who need experienced big shepherds to lead and teach them.

As an agent of the gospel, may you know the joy of being recognized with the blessing, "He's a shepherd."

Like a game of hide-and-go-seek, 'ready or not,' it's time to begin planning for 2014!

During the 2013 Charge Conference, District Superintendent Bob Parks focused our attention on worship attendance as one of the **fruits of a vital congregation**. He challenged us to show that we are bearing fruit in this area of ministry. Antioch has experienced a 10% increase in worship attendance over the last year, a tremendous sign of vitality. The Holy Spirit is working in Lunenburg!

This year's vital congregations' focus will be encouraging new professions of faith. This is something we need to be attentive to, as neither church has added a new, first-time church member in quite a while.

So as to focus more on ministry and less on business, **Charge Conference** will be held on Sunday, November 3 with our Discipleship Circle: Victoria UMC, Kenbridge UMC and the Nottoway-Lunenburg Charge. The Conference will occur at Kenbridge UMC from 3 to 5 pm, with dinner to follow.

- September: Lay Leadership (nominations) and Finance Committees prepare proposals
- Early October: Church councils act on finance and committee requests
- Mid-October: Charge Conference reports prepared and submitted
