

Ash Wednesday Service

It is the 40 non-Sundays before Easter, and we mark the season with the sanctuary color purple (like Advent, the church's other season of preparation). Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and an occasion for repentance. Ashes in the sign of the cross are placed on the forehead as a sign that we recognize our mortality and turn to God for salvation.

On Wednesday, March 5, we will gather at Antioch at 7 pm for a service of worship, repentance and ashes, as we begin preparing for a life which triumphs over death in Jesus Christ, whom God raised from the dead.

Daylin is a sweet child, who lives in a poor rural community located at the western part of Honduras. Fortunately, she has no mental or physical disabilities; and stays healthy most of the time. She attends elementary school and her favorite subject is drawing. Furthermore, she likes to play with dolls. She lives with her parents and a brother. Her father, Wilberto, is a farmer who cultivates corn and beans. Her mother, Daysi, is a housewife. Both parents are literate. Their low income is approximately of US\$ 60.00 monthly, which is not enough to cover even their most basic needs. This family lives in their own house,

made of adobe walls, zinc roof and cement floor. It also has all the public services found in their location. Our UMW sponsorship will contribute to support the different programs aimed in providing children a better quality of education and health community services; as well as support in additional programs to favor the community development as part of the priorities of this Development Area.
