Re-turning to God

Here we are once again. It's that time of year. Lent.

As I was reminded this week, Lent "is more than giving up chocolate." Isn't that kind of how we approach these 40 days? A half-hearted promise to "give up something" because, well... that's what we do in Lent.

The idea is that we sacrifice something of value as a way of joining Jesus' pilgrimage towards the cross. That's where he gave up his life for us. The least we could do is to sacrifice chocolate (ice cream, sodas, beer, shopping, movies, insert your object here...).

Sacrificing something we enjoy serves as a daily reminder that we are being invited to walk more closely with Christ. Actually, "invited" is too casual a word. Called. Each of us is being Called by God to take a look at ourselves; to see ourselves with the light of Christ shining on us.

The biblical call to re-turn toward God is heard in the words of John the Baptist (Mat 3:2) and of Jesus (Mat 4:17). Peter preaches it at Pentecost (Acts 2:38) and in Revelation (2:5, 2:16 and 3:20) the risen Christ calls established churches to "turn toward God."

In each of these occasions God's people are called to turn toward God with the command: "change your hearts and lives."

Repentance is intended by God to be life changing. Not 40 day change. Life change. Our sacrificial acts during Lent are intended to transform our lives *forever*. When we give up something of great value, we are reminded daily of God's presence, faithfulness and love.

Time and time again, we say how valuable our time is. Time is a precious resource, and we "wish we had more time." Life's demands lead us to exclaim that we can't "spare the time."

This Lent, I invite you – no, I *call* you – to sacrifice something of real value. To sacrifice this most valuable treasure – your time.

Dedicate some of your time to God by reading or listening to the Bible, praying, reading a daily devotional. If you currently give God 15 minutes a day, double it to 30. If 30, make it 45 minutes. If you are presently offering God none of your time, then try 10 minutes a day, increasing it week by week.

But be careful! If you give up something of real value, you might find God changing your life. Forever.

"Mission Moment" for Prayer Breakfast

At the upcoming prayer breakfast all units are asked to bring their "free mission items" for the Kingdom Party. That means your collected labels for education, your cancelled stamps, your box tops for education and your tin pop tops! How will this help our mission purpose? The labels for education are sent to Henry Fork Service Center in Rocky Mount, VA. Since their new van has been purchased, they are saving the labels to get free electronics for their after school programs. The box tops for education labels are sent to Red Bird Mission and Henderson Settlement in KY to purchase art and athletic supplies, as well as books and electronics for their school and library. The pop tops from cans are taken to the Ronald McDonald House in Durham, NC near Duke Hospital, where the families of very sick children can stay. Did you know that the UMW has been collecting cancelled stamps since 1982? How does that help our mission statement? In these 32 years \$4,526 has been donated to UMCOR through the sale of thousands of used stamps that you usually toss in the trash can. The stamps should be cut from the envelope leaving ¼ inch border around them. The pre-sorted, nonprofit org. stamps are not needed as they have no monetary value. When the stamps are taken to a district or conference event, they are given to the York River District ladies and they give them to Jean Smith who takes them to a stamp collector and distributor. Now, do you see how your free stuff can be recycled to help many worthwhile projects?
