The Preachers' Part

This summer we will embark on a spiritual journey. In our weekly worship and Bible study group we will journey with the first disciples as they experience God in Jesus' absence.

"Windswept" is the bold drama that is the book of Acts. It tells the story of God's faithfulness in sending the Holy Spirit, as promised. It is the story of the people's faithful response, and their struggle to be faithful. And it's the story of the Spirit – led adventure into uncharted waters, when the disciples of Jesus went places and did things they never, ever thought possible. They were "Windswept."

But our summer series is not just to hear about someone else's journey, listening to tales of another's "summer vacation." The Acts of the Apostles was written as inspired by the Holy Spirit. We read it (and all scripture) by the Holy Spirit's guidance. Those old stories are vitally relevant to us today – to our spiritual journey.

The bold drama that is the book of Acts tells the story of God's faithfulness in sending the Holy Spirit *to us*. It is the story of *our* faithful response, and *our* struggle to be faithful, because it's not always easy honoring our commitments. And it's the story of the Spirit – led adventure into uncharted waters, when *we*, disciples of Jesus, go places and do things we never, ever thought possible.

I often hear folks lament that the Ten Commandments are no longer publicly displayed. The first four of those commandments have to do with our faithfulness toward God. They rightfully assume God's faithfulness to us.

1) Nothing is more important than God. 2) There is no substitute for God (no idols!). 3) "Don't use God's name as if it were of no significance" (CEB Ex 20:7). And, 4) Remember the day of worship- it is a Holy Day.

This summer, as we are being renewed and revitalized and challenged, you are invited to join me in a covenant with God: to demonstrate a faithful commitment to God by engaging in one hour a day of spiritual disciplines. It is a time devoted just for the One who is most important. Spiritual disciplines are praying, reading the Bible, studying devotionals and meditation. It's okay to do this in two or three segments each day.

I will guide you to resources and help devise a plan that works for you. Talk with me. I am praying for you to be *Windswept*.
